WHOEVER BELIEVES IN ME WILL NEVER THIRST

If you have ever been on a diet or if you have fasted, you know the feeling of being hungry. Reducing our consumption of food leaves us with hunger pangs that are hard to ignore. Of course, this type of hunger pales in comparison with those who truly lack the nourishment they need. Some lack drinkable water. Their thirst is unimaginable to people who simply turn on a tap from which fresh water flows. There is another kind of hunger and thirst that is part of the human experience. Many of us hunger for a deep relationship with God. This spiritual hunger is sometimes not conscious, until we are attentive to it. The Israelites in the desert and the people who followed Jesus across the sea experienced a flash of insight that changed them. Suddenly, their hunger was about more than food for their physical sustenance. They became aware of their spiritual thirst, which only God can quench. What spiritual hunger do you recognize?

THIRST QUENCHED, WE BECOME THIRSTY

Once we become attuned to our great longing for God, we grow in trust that Jesus is the bread of life who fills us with God's goodness. Assured that we need never hunger again, our faith leads us to thirst—for justice, mercy, or care for those who are on the peripheries, and for an ever-greater relationship with God and within the Christian community. With this spiritual growth, we recognize that we must act in order to meet the needs of those who are physically hungry or thirsty, and that we may have the opportunity to lead others to Jesus, the bread from heaven that gives life to the world. In what ways is Jesus your bread of life? How are you called to provide bread, physical or spiritual, to others?

Renewal of Mind and Bread from Heaven.

Those who go to daily Mass have the opportunity to allow the Readings of each day to take root in their hearts. But even if you do not make it to Mass you can ponder the Word from Sunday's Gospel. There are also many publications and websites available to read the church's reading for each day.

...“be renewed in the spirit of your minds and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.” In Romans, St. Paul writes, “to be transformed by the renewal of your minds. We cannot do this alone. By allowing God's Word to take root and dwell within us, our minds are transformed. God does a mighty work within us, He accomplishes His works when we open our heart to Him.

When we come to Mass, hearing the word of God and receiving the Bread of Life; Do we hear the words of the Readings and the prayers of Mass with our ears alone? Or do we hear with our hearts? Do we allow the Word of God, rich as it is to dwell within us? Do we take God's direction to us in His Word seriously? Do we realize who we are receiving? Do we ponder the Bread of Life in our hearts? The answer to these questions should not be a simple yes, but a profound Yes!

At the close of the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest says, “through Him, with Him and in Him, O God Almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all glory and honor are yours forever and ever.” This is the mystery we believe, the ministry of the Trinity. The *In, Through and With* Jesus makes all things possible. We live, move and have our being in Jesus Christ. Through Him, we have access to the Father, with Him we give Glory to the Father, only in His Spirit do we accomplish good works. Our response should not be a simple amen, but realizing what is taking place on that altar, our response is a profound AMEN!

Life gets busy and it is hard to carve out special time for prayer and meditation. But even on days when there is so much going on in our lives we can take the Word of God and the Bread of Life with us if we have pondered what we have seen and heard in the Liturgy.

The question posed by the people in today's Gospel: What can we do to accomplish the works of God? BELIEVE that what you see and hear at Mass is the Real Deal! Listen with a ear yearning to hear Jesus speak to you. Be aware of His Presence as close as your heartbeat.

Little Flowers and Blue Knights

Little Flowers and Blue Knights meet on the third Friday Evening of each month, 6 to 7:45 PM in the Family Center.

Our **Little Flowers Girls' Club** is a Catholic program for girls, ages 5 to 9. The goal is to provide the girls with an opportunity to gather and learn about their Catholic heritage, faith and traditions. The Little Flowers earn patches monthly. This is accomplished by completing related activities during the meeting and at home. The activities reflect the topics covered during the meeting.

Our **Blue Knights Boys' Club** is a Catholic program for boys (ages 5 to 9). The boys will gather in the company of other Catholic boys to learn about their faith while having fun! Many activities and crafts focus on working together to complete a task or solve a problem.

The boys earn patches also. During each meeting a virtue, scripture and saint will be introduced through catechesis, crafts, games and activities. Fathers are welcomed and encouraged to attend monthly meetings.

These Clubs offer girls and boys (ages 5 to 9) of the parish a Catholic club focusing on the beauty of our faith, virtues and saints. They instill in our children, a firm foundation of faith while having fun and fostering friendships with other Catholic children. The intention of the clubs is to plant the seeds of virtue so that they may continue to grow in God's Grace.

As parents these are the virtues we want to grow in our children to equip them for when they need to swim upstream and not with the flow of the secular world.

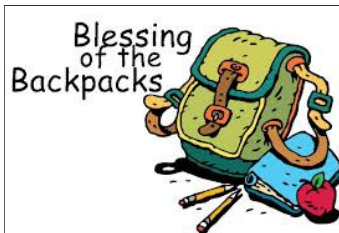

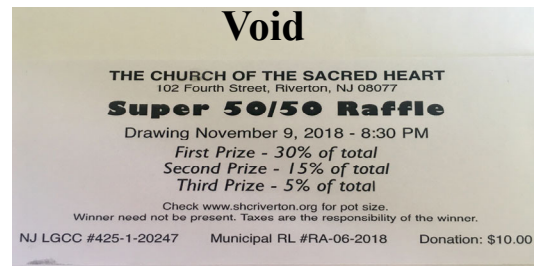
